PARENT POWER!

This term, let's get talking about Annual Reviews....

Understanding Your Child's EHCP Annual Review

As a parent or carer of a Woodlands student, you'll already be familiar with your child's Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP). The annual review is the statutory process of looking at the needs, provision and outcomes specified in an EHCP plan, and deciding whether these need to change. Your local authority (LA) must complete the first review of your child's EHC plan within 12 months of the EHC plan being finalised. Subsequent reviews must be completed within 12 months of the previous review.

The following steps must take place in an annual review:

- A parental contribution sheet will be sent to you along with your child's EHCP paperwork, so that your views, wishes and feelings can be taken in to account. But many parents chose to contribute verbally in the meeting instead.**

An annual review meeting must take place to discuss the EHC plan.

- After the meeting, Woodlands will update any paperwork with any agreed amendments.**
 - After the meeting the LA reviews the EHC plan.**
 - The LA will notify you of its decision / any changes within four weeks of the meeting.**
- All of these steps – not just the meeting – must be followed in order for an annual review to be completed.**

Your Child's Annual Review – A Special Invitation

We'll be sending you an invitation for your child's annual review—and we'd love for you to join us. These meetings are a wonderful opportunity to sit down with your child's teacher and celebrate all the progress they've made this year. This is a chance for us to hear your views and what you feel is important for your child, and an opportunity for you to make requests for additional support.

It's a dedicated hour where we come together to share insights, discuss any concerns, and explore ways we can continue to support your child's learning and wellbeing. You'll also have the chance to meet other professionals who may be involved in your child's journey, such as the transitions team.

Most importantly, it's a personal and uplifting moment to hear stories from the classroom, see your child through their teacher's eyes, and feel proud of everything they've achieved.

We look forward to welcoming you!

Drop in to our unique Colour/Music Sensory Installation in the Hat Factory Art Centre Studio space and create your own world of colour and music through movement.

Large fabric "sails" fill the space and reflect and mix colours and light that you, the public, create yourselves. Our resident composer, David Stevens, will be in the Space to show you how to create whole orchestras of sound with just the movement of your hands, feet - or literally any part of your body - moving over special laser movement sensors. Sound-paintings can also be played by moving your hands over the surface and you can "paint" rainbows of colour around the space.

There will be a special performance by local students from **Woodlands Secondary School of their own "Symphony of the Senses" ahead of public access. Students will have learnt new techniques of music and visual art to create a sensory performance. Then the installation stays open until 4pm for you to explore.**
